What does a greeter do?

By serving as a greeter today you have the opportunity to make The Journey's first impression on our guests. Many times people make a decision about a church based on their first impressions. One of the core values at The Journey is that we would create an authentic and non-threatening environment. You have the opportunity to convey that from the moment people walk in the door.

What does a Hospitality Host do?

What does an usher do?
